* The vaccines in **bold** print are required for school attendance under the *Immunization of School Pupils Act*. Varicella vaccine required for children born in 2010 or later.

¹ Vaccines required at 12 months of age should be given on or after the first birthday.

² Influenza vaccination is recommended every year at 6 months of age and older.

³ Following one dose of Tetanus, Diphtheria, Pertussis (Tdap) in adulthood, adults should receive a Tetanus & Diphtheria (Td) booster every 10 years.

⁴ Pregnant persons in every pregnancy, regardless of Tdap immunization history receive one dose, ideally between 27-32 weeks of gestation.

⁵ Pneumococcal Polysaccharide 23 given ≥ 65 years of age.

⁶ Herpes Zoster - Shingles (two-dose schedule) is routine between 65-70 and should be completed prior to 71st birthday.
